ASSEMBLIES ARE BACK

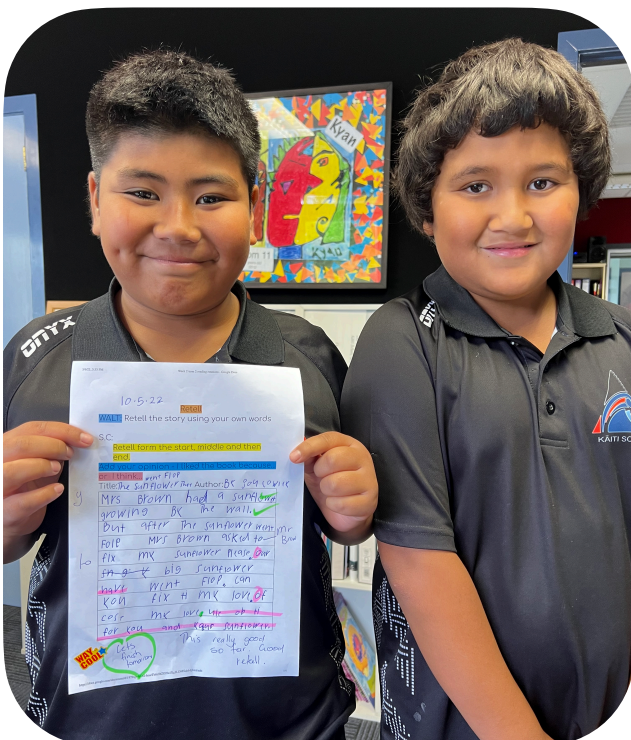
