Matariki Moments @ Kaiti

Across the kura we have been learning about Maramataka, the Māori Lunar Calendar and Matariki - Te Tau Hou Māori. Every class has learnt the whakapapa of Matariki, every whetu that is part of Te kahui whetu o Matariki and its role in the cluster, the special role of Te waka o Rangi, the waka in the sky and Hautapu - the special early morning karakia and celebrations that occur across the country. A big mihi to our kaiako who have taken the time to research and learn more about Matariki so that they can teach our Tamariki about this special time of year.

Tuakana /Teina - this term we have been learning alongside others, older students with younger students. This week our Roopu have been learning together for Matariki. Above Boss of Whare Tipu and Shiloh of Whare o Aroha learn together about the Whetu Tupuarangi and all the kai that comes from above the ground and the skies. Did you know Kererū were harvested for kai celebration by our tīpuna during Matariki.

Matariki – a time to set new goals – Whānau Hui – Wednesday 29 June @ 5pm.


