Welcome!!



At Red! Masks and Covid Protection framework at kura. We continue to contend with the fallout of COVID. At Red Level our Year 4 and up are wearing masks in class but don't have to wear

them outside. We are ensuring spacing, and have increased hygiene practices. At Red level there are no large mass gatherings, like assemblies and we are keeping visitors to a minimum at kura.
