#### Covid19 Updates

We have had **65 students return** to kura this week from isolation with **148 students still in isolation** at home. Of this 148 students there are about 20 students who should now be back at kura. It is important that whānau keep the school informed of their tamariki's progress and return to kura dates. We understand that some of these students may now have tested positive or have continuing symptons. Please just keep us informed whānau.

Staffing is being carefully managed by our DP Kōkā Mandy to ensure that every class has a teacher each day. We currently have 10 staff members in isolation. Our teacher aides have been doing extra mahi to get resources to teachers who are in isolation for planning, office staff have picked up social service mahi, we have all had to mobilise and change our routines to ensure the day is a good one for our tamariki. I was visiting classes this morning and was

our tamariki. I was visiting classes this morning and was so proud and pleased of the enormous efforts staff are investing into running balanced, effective learning programmes. The learning continues here. It also continues at home with distance learning. When students feel well enough to get back into some mahi in isolation please check your child's class Facebook page. Every class has a programme up on their pages for students to continue with at home.

### Returning to Kura to learn

We have noticed the students are returning, excited to be back into their learning routines. We encourage these students who are coming back to kura to take it easy for those first few days because for some, they are still getting their energy levels back to where they were pre isolation. Take one day at a time.

## Supporting whānau

If you have been wondering why Kaiti whānau are not getting the message to go to the Puku Ora drive through for kai, it is because our Kai trays are delivered to kura each day and delivered in isolation daily. Because of the vast numbers of families now in isolation we share the Kai, delivering to a different set of whānau every afternoon. Big mihi to our kaimahi who are delivering every day.
